



One of the most widely known Chinese men ever to make his mark in America was Bruce Lee, a martial arts artiste. Bruce Lee was born in California in 1940 but raised in Hong Kong. He left for America in 1958. Ever since he was a child, Bruce Lee had been trained in the martial arts, and by the time he reached America, he was an expert.

At first, he had a difficult time settling into the American way of life. He worked in a restaurant for a short time, but soon left to attend a local university. There, he made friends with a group of local Americans. They had never seen Chinese martial arts before and were amazed by Bruce Lee's skill in fighting. They encouraged him to open up a school, teaching others how to fight like him. He did so and the school was very successful.

Soon, Bruce Lee started to run into problems with some Chinese in America. They did not like him teaching their ancient Chinese fighting skills to foreigners and tried to stop Bruce Lee from doing this, In order to settle the dispute, Bruce Lee fought with a Chinese martial arts champion. Whoever won the fight would decide whether Bruce Lee could continue teaching Chinese martial arts to foreigners. Bruce Lee won the fight.

Soon, his martial arts school was so well-known that he was offered acting roles on television and in the movies. After a while, he left America and returned to Hong Kong to make a few movies. Bruce Lee would probably have become a very illustrious movie star if not for one thing – he died suddenly in 1973 at the age of thirty-two. Many people still remember him today as one of the greatest martial arts artistes who ever lived.

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow.

A humanoid is a robot that closely looks like a human and has an upper body, two arms, two legs and a head. It does not necessarily resemble a human in all aspects as some humanoids have a helmet instead of a face. They can respond to humans but they cannot show any emotions in what they do. They are created for the purpose of doing tedious and repetitive work.

In Germany, a humanoid has been created to perform in shows. Before it can be in a show, it has to be trained to learn about what is appropriate and inappropriate human behaviour. It also has to learn more about itself. The researcher moves its arms to give it a feel of what it is like to move one's limbs. Soon, it will learn to move its arms when it hears certain kinds of music.

The greatest scientific challenge for researchers at the moment is to get the robots to act according to their will instead of just following programmed instructions that they need to learn. They need to be able to react appropriately when interacting with humans.

Despite the excitement over the success of humanoids and the future of having them in our society, it is still uncertain about whether humans and humanoids can live peacefully with each other. Watching a humanoid perform in a play on the stage is different from one serving you food at a restaurant. Can it take on the role of a teacher? Even with extensive programming, a humanoid will not be able to take on the role of a teacher fully. Can the humanoid fully express the emotions of a human like laughing and cheering when there is success or will it be emotionless? At the same time, can it control its anger in reacting to humans and channel it in a less dangerous way? These are some questions which researchers have to answer.
