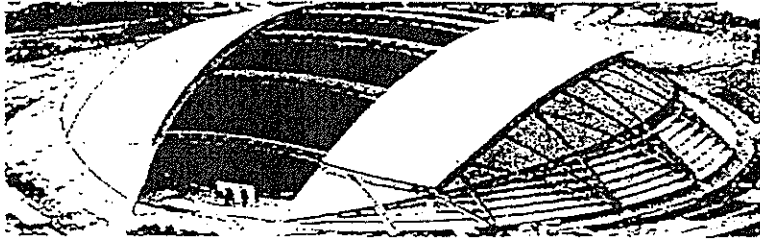

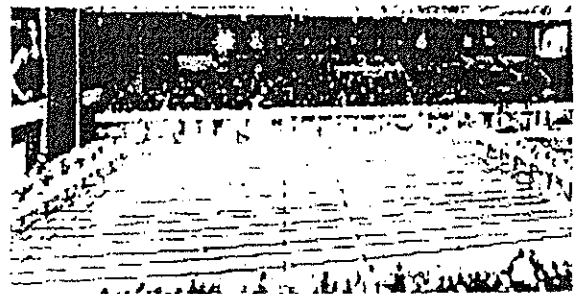

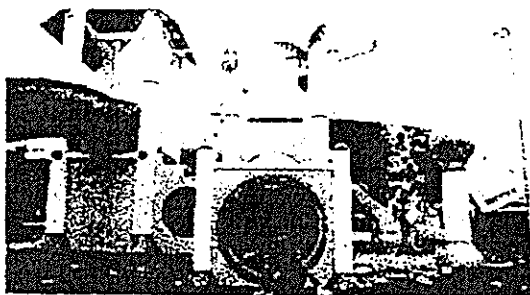


The **National Stadium** has a seating capacity of 55,000 people. All the soccer matches will be played here.

Gelato is popular among Singaporeans and foreigners. There are at least 120 gelato shops in Singapore. It is therefore not surprising that Singapore is a "Gelato Capital" of Asia. There is a gelato competition, World's Best Gelato title and Singapore has sent in six local gelato flavours. These flavours are among the 16 other flavours shortlisted for the title. To be shortlisted, the gelato flavours have to be creative, unique and representative of the country. 5

Mr Alfero is the creator of one of the six local gelato flavours. He found inspiration from his favourite local dessert, which led to his creation of the 'Chendol' gelato. It is made from coconut milk, gula melaka (a type of sugar), red beans and pandan jelly. He said, "I wanted something new for the competition. Chendol is representative of Singapore. Most Singaporeans love Chendol and it is one of the favourite local desserts in Singapore." 10 15
