

Aunt Liz and my cat, Bobbi, lay quietly on the sofa as she read her novel. This had become quite a common sight on most afternoons. My parents were both at work and only Aunt Liz, my mother's sister, was available. She did not have an office so most of the time she worked from the comfort of our house. However, until a few months ago, seeing them sitting peacefully side by side like this was nearly impossible.

Bobbi, named after a character in my favourite book when I was in kindergarten, came into our life about a year ago. After seeing how lonely I was as an only child, my parents decided to get me a cat. Aunt Liz started to take care of me around the same time too. However, she and Bobbi were not on friendly terms. They did not seem to like each other. Aunt Liz had no fear of animals but she just did not like cats. Bobbi somehow knew this part of her instinctively. From 10 then on, he began to find every opportunity to annoy her.

Bobbi was like most cats I knew. He lazed around and ignored us most of the time. He would just purr to ask for food. If the food came late, he would purr noisily and harass us till he got his meal. My family did not have any complaints but his actions gave my aunt nightmares. My aunt was no better. Once she fed him late due to an online meeting with her boss. He became annoyed after much purring. The next thing I knew, he was on her head, pulling her nicely tied up hair and messing it. She could not stop jumping about, trying to get him off. To make matters worse, her boss had been watching all along. Aunt Liz was clearly embarrassed. As a witness to this, I was clearly tickled by the scene.

I really wondered if Aunt Liz delayed his feeding on purpose sometimes. She knew he would fight back because there were instances, due to late feeding, he would jump on her whenever she entered the kitchen in the middle of the night. Of course, that would be followed by a hysterical scream. Why did they really hate each other that much?

However, it took a fateful event to change their relationship. One morning, my parents forgot to close our gate when they left for work. I was playing with my dolls and Aunt Liz was. 25 busy typing away on her laptop in the living room. As usual, Bobbi was nowhere in sight. Suddenly, we heard a low growl. I looked up and saw a fierce-looking dog snarling at me. I was visibly shaken. "Don't move!" Aunt Liz called out. She stood up slowly from the couch and moved away from her new enemy. As she inched herself closer to me, I could feel my legs trembling with fear. At that moment, sensing movement, the dog leapt. Aunt Liz stepped in and 30 the dog landed on her. I fell backwards in shock. Out of the blue, I heard a loud hiss. Bobbi was staring monacingly at the dog. Aunt Liz quickly took hold of one of my dolls and aimed it at a tall vase nearby. It toppled and broke into smithereens as it landed on the floor. The crashing sound sent the dog scurrying away.

Although that episode sent a chill down my spine every time it crossed my mind, I felt safe. 35 I realised they were highly protective of me. Interestingly, their behaviour towards each other gradually changed after the incident. I could sense some peace between them. They were still not the best of friends but they found comfort in each other occasionally. Lounging on the sofa together had become one of their favourite pastimes.
