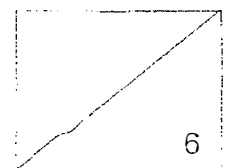

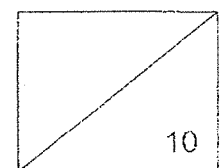

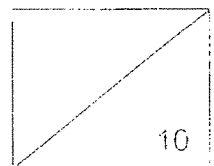

In eastern Africa, a volcano rises more than 19,000 feet into the sky. It is Mount Kilimanjaro, one of the world's tallest mountains. Every year, thousands of people try to climb to the top but fewer than half succeed. Montannah Kenney of Texas recently **beat the odds**. She climbed the mountain with her mother and was one of the youngest climbers to ever reach the peak, at age seven.

"It felt great to reach my goal," Montannah said.

Montannah's adventure began about two years before the climb when she found out her mother was planning to conquer Kilimanjaro. She begged to go too. "I wanted to see what it was like above the clouds," she said.

The Kenneys knew it was important to be prepared. They practised hiking on hills near their home and did their research. They also discovered the need to prepare for the unpredictable weather conditions they would encounter. While the base of Kilimanjaro offered warmth, the summit was covered in icy terrain and freezing temperatures.

Montannah and her mother were aware of the risks involved in climbing Mount Kilimanjaro, particularly the dangers of altitude sickness. The higher they climbed, the tougher it was for them to breathe, and ascending too rapidly could have severe consequences on their health too. With this knowledge in mind, they meticulously planned a route that would allow for a gradual ascent, giving their bodies ample time to adjust to the changing altitude.

Filled with determination and excitement, Montannah and her mother embarked on their journey. The experienced guides, who possessed a deep understanding of the mountain's terrain, were their steadfast companions throughout the challenging expedition. They skilfully led the way, ensuring the safety and well-being of the courageous climbers.

As they ascended higher, the air grew thinner, making each step **more demanding than the last**. Nevertheless, the breathtaking beauty that surrounded them spurred them forward. But even with teamwork, the six-day climb to the top was tough. The group hiked for nine hours or more each day and it rained or snowed almost the whole time. That made the rocky mountain slippery.

One day, Montannah felt sick to her stomach. Her mother, worried that it might be altitude sickness, suggested turning back. Montannah refused to give up. After resting for a bit, she felt better and was given the clearance to continue the climb. Two days later, she made it to the top of the mountain. "I was finally above the clouds!" she said.

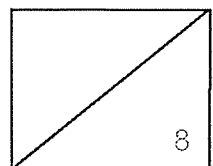

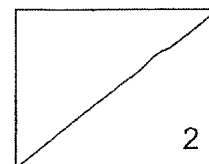
