Write a composition of at least 120 words about a day when something went wrong.

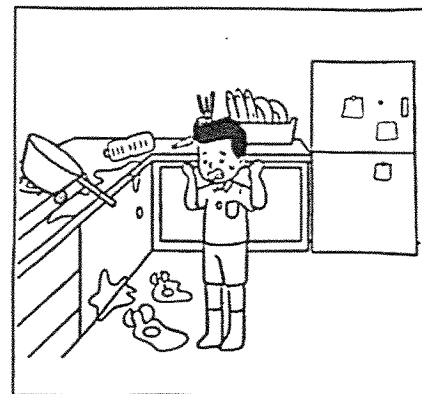
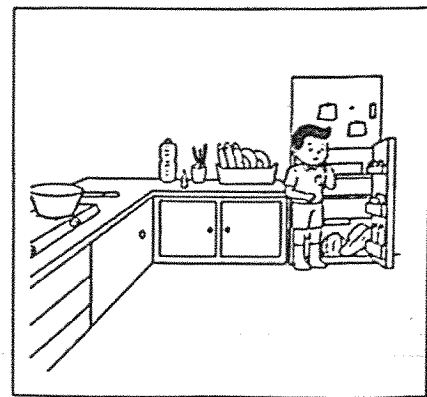
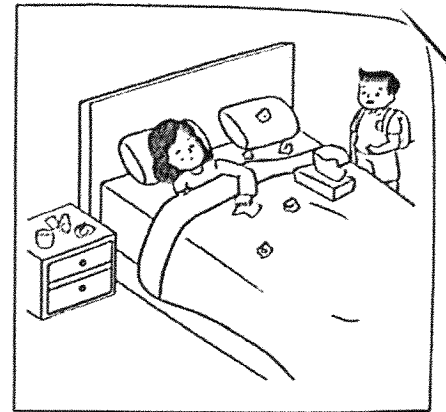
The pictures, not arranged in sequence, are provided to help you think about this topic.
